Reminders!

All our guest must be signing in and out of our guest log in the front and grabbing a guest badge. This is to ensure safety throughout our community!

OVERNIGHT GUESTS

Grace Assisted Living does allow for an overnight visitor to stay with the resident. The guest must sign into the guest log and check in with facility staff. Any stays longer than 3 consecutive nights must be approved by the facility administrator or designee. Any overnight guests that **have not signed into the guest log** and are present in the building between the hours of 9pm and 6am will be considered trespassing. If guests become disruptive or verbally or physically abusive to residents, our associates or others, we may request that they leave the Community and restrict current or future visitation.

Pet Policy

All resident's pets shall reside in the resident's apartment. Pets shall be allowed in the common areas but must be under the control of the owner or handler. No cages, containers, perches, etc. may be constructed or used outside of the building. No pet shall be allowed to be loose on the Residence grounds or roadways in the surrounding areas. Resident pets shall not be allowed in the dining room, and maybe discouraged from being in the common areas if problems arise.

Resident must be able to take care of all pet needs including feeding and cleanup. All dogs shall be toileted outside of the residence and excrement picked up and disposed of immediately. Litter from litter boxes or cages must be disposed of in a sealed plastic bag and placed promptly in proper trash can or dumpster located on the site. Pet waste and or litter shall not be disposed of in the toilets. Pets shall be refrained from toileting on the floors and are only to be fed inside the resident's apartment.
